SHOW RULES

1. The Shows will be conducted in accordance with the rules and standards contained in THE ROYAL HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY'S Horticultural Show Handbook and the National Association of Flower Arrangements Societies of Great Britain, except where under this schedule they obviously do not apply.
2. Unless otherwise stated all exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor and must have been in his/her possession for at least two months, unless a shorter period is specified in the schedule.
3. In order to be satisfied that the conditions governing competitive exhibits are fulfilled, the Committee reserves the right to visit by commission, before or after a show, gardens from which plants, flowers, fruit or vegetables have been entered for competition.
4. Not more than one person may enter an exhibit of the same kind from the same garden, nursery or plant house in any one class. This does not apply where plant material need not have been grown by the exhibitor.
5. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry and, in the event of such a refusal, it is not to be required to give any reason or explanation.
6. In all cases where cut material is shown, all stems must reach the water in the vase or other receptacle.
7. All exhibits should be correctly named. Errors in naming will not disqualify but the judges should regard correctness and clearness of naming as telling in favour of an exhibit in close competition. If the exhibitor does not know the name of any cultivar the label should bear the words NAME UNKNOWN. Where an unnamed seedling is shown the label should bear the word SEEDLING.
8. No exhibitor may exhibit more than one entry per class.
9. Any prize may be withheld or modified if the exhibits are considered unworthy of the prize offered.
10. On the relative merits of the exhibits the decisions of the judges shall be final but the Committee reserves to itself the decision on any other points in dispute.
11. Any protest must be made in writing, with a deposit of 50p, to the Show Secretary within one hour of the opening of the show to the public. If upheld the deposit will be returned.
12. After judging has taken place no exhibit or part of an exhibit may be altered or removed until the end of the show, except by the permission of the Show Secretary.
13. All exhibits, personal property etc., shall be at the risk of the exhibitors, and the Society shall not be liable for compensation for loss or damage from any cause whatsoever. Should a Show for any cause not be held, no exhibitor shall have any claim on the Society.
14. Except for flower arrangements vases supplied at the Show must be used. Where bowls are called for these must be supplied by the exhibitor.
15. Dahlias, gladioli and other specialised flowers shall, where applicable, be judged under the classification and rules of the specialist societies concerned.
16. Entry forms accompanied by the appropriate fee must be returned by the time noted on the form.
17. Entrance fees (unless otherwise stated) Championship Classes 40p per class; Open Classes 25p per class; Members Classes 10p per class; Junior classes no fee.
18. Exhibits must occupy the places on the show table indicated by the exhibitors card. When the exhibit is staged the card must be reversed.
19. No exhibitor may move or otherwise interfere with another exhibit.
20. Cups and Trophies are perpetual trophies and must be returned to the Show Secretary not less than 14 days prior to the corresponding show next year. Winners are responsible for safe custody and will be held liable for any damage.
21. NOVICE: In this schedule the definition of Novice is a member who has not won a FIRST PRIZE for that particular flower or class, unless otherwise stated.

LISTON HALL

Staging may take place from 8pm to 9pm on 25TH August and from 8am to 11am on the day of the show, at which time all people other than officials must leave the hall for judging to commence at 11.15 am.

NO ENTRIES ACCEPTED ON DAY OF SHOW
